Brian Sumrall served as an ASHA and SHOT clinician and judge for over 10 years. This service has has taken him throughout Texas and South-Eastern US promoting ranch versatility and the versatile stock horse. In 2011 Brian trained Peptos Special Kay and Cinco Silver Drift to multiple All-around Championships in versatility competition, as well as ASHA Region 1 Championship. He has trained and shown numerous state and national High-Point Champions and one Reserve World Champion. He was a founding member of the SHOT Assoc. and currently serves of the Board of Directors with ASHA and the Texas Quarter Horse Assoc.

Dr. Clay Cavinder is an associate professor of equine science and serves as the coach of the TAMU Horse Judging Team. He has his doctrine in equine reproductive physiology and teaches numerous courses focusing on how nutrition and exercise affect reproductive efficiency of the stallion and the mare.
